TIPS FOR UNDOCUMENTED WORKERS INJURED WHILE WORKING

- Do not provide a social security number that you know is false for **ANYTHING** related to your workers' compensation claim. This includes signing any documents with the false number typed on the form.
- There is no requirement under the workers' compensation law to provide a social security number, state identification card (e.g. driver's license), or a social security card in order to apply for or recieve benefits.
- The insurance adjuster and/or case manager for the insurance company are employees of the insurance company. While they may help sometimes, their job is to help the insurance company over helping the injured worker.
- KNOW YOUR RIGHTS. If you are being told you have to provide certain information or documents that you know is false, consult with an attorney regarding your rights and obligations under the law.
